Mr. Mueller has been with the OUIHP since February 2014 and previously served as the Health System Specialist with OUIHP, where he provided policy analysis and development support for a wide-range of health care delivery and support activities for 41 urban Indian organizations. Before joining the IHS, Mr. Mueller worked a number of years in Alaska with regional Native health corporations, serving in various administrative capacities. Mr. Mueller holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, AZ, and later earned a master's degree in business administration, with a concentration in health service administration, from Alaska Pacific University in Anchorage, AK.
