#### Conclusions: Pathways to Improved STI and HIV Care

#### Advancing STI Care: Key Recommendations



Address Barriers: Secure additional funding sources to expand resources for comprehensive STI services, including increased screening options and treatment accessibility.



Enhance Collaboration: Forge partnerships with local health departments and community-based organizations to share resources and expertise, leading to more coordinated and effective STI prevention and treatment efforts.



Culturally Tailored Outreach: Invest in outreach and education initiatives tailored to the urban Indian community to reduce stigma and improve health-seeking behaviors regarding STIs.



Utilize Telehealth: Implement telehealth platforms for STI consultations and follow-up appointments to improve access to care, particularly for individuals in remote or underserved areas.



Data-driven Approach:
Prioritize data collection and evaluation mechanisms to monitor service utilization, patient outcomes, and satisfaction levels, enabling ongoing optimization of STI services.
