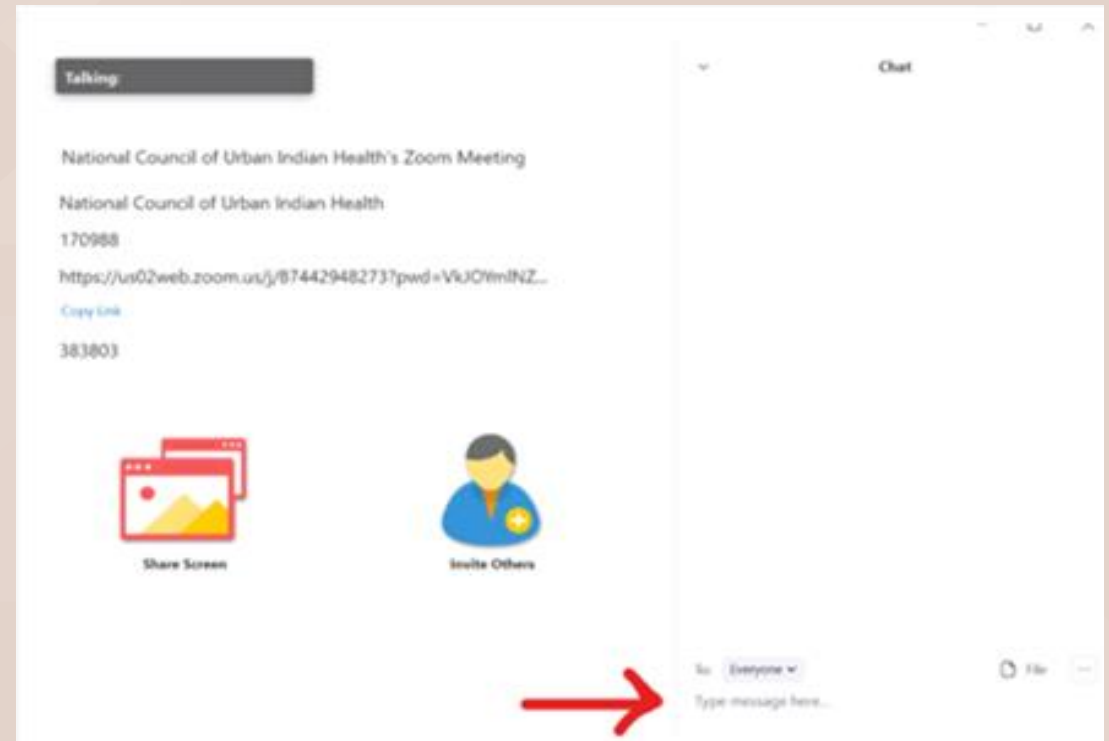
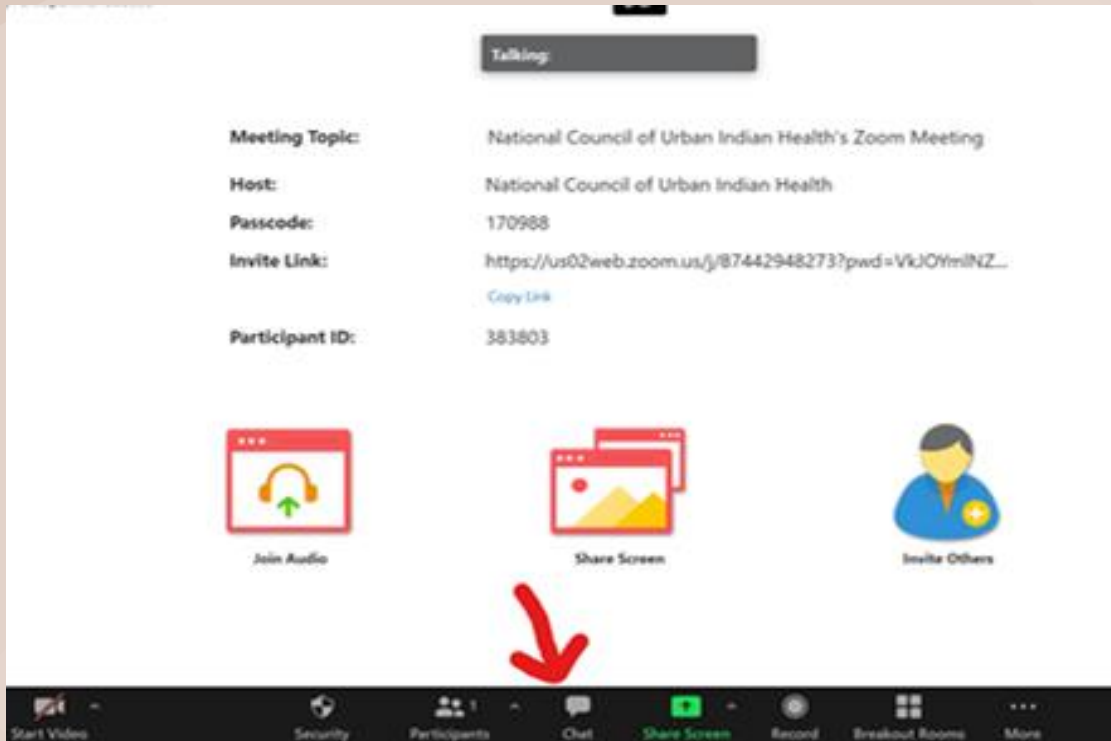

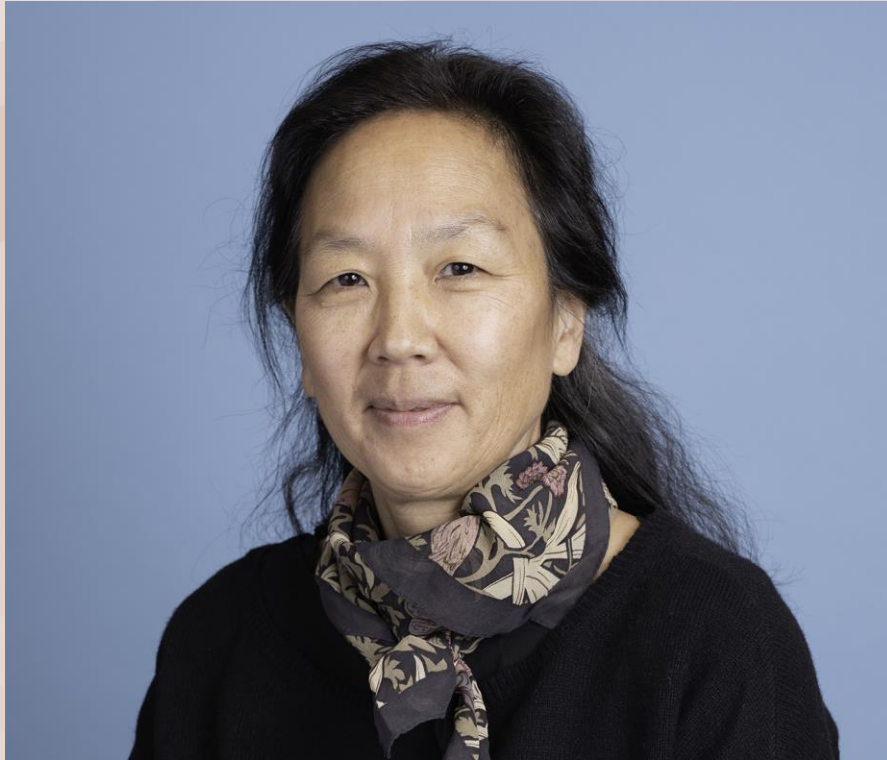

ENDING THE HIV EPIDEMIC

- Diagnose
 - Diagnose as early as possible
- Treat
 - Treat to reach viral suppression
- Prevent
 - Use proven intervention such as PrEP and Syring Exchange
- Respond
 - Respond quickly to potential HIV outbreak

HIV PREVENTION PROGRAM

- Albuquerque NM
 - Surrounding Pueblos, Sandia, Isleta, Santa Ana, San Felipe, Santa Domingo
- Farmington NM
 - 3 hour drive
- Gallup NM
 - 2 hours
- Northwest NM, Navajo Nation, Zuni Pueblo

PREVENTION SERVICES

- Confidential Rapid HIV testing
 - INSTI and Allere
- Safer sex supplies
 - Condoms, lube, safer sex kits
- Resource and Referrals
 - MOUs, Collaborating Agencies, CPAG, CPAG Summit,
- Rapid Syphilis Testing, coming soon

PREVENTION SERVICES

- Evidence Based Curriculums
 - SISTA
 - Native SISTA
 - Native Transwoman facilitator
 - 3MV
 - Native Men, Native Voices
 - Native Gay Man facilitator
 - Healthy Relationships
 - Person Living with HIV facilitator
 - Workshops are done in all three locations

CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

- Non Medical Case Management
 - Housing
 - Emergency assistance
 - Food
 - ...
- Medical Case Management
 - Labs
 - Doctors visits
 - Medical appointments
 - Dental
 - Mental Health

CASE MANAGEMENT SERVICES

- Unique services
 - Certain NM Medicaid programs provides traditional Healing assistance
 - NM HSP provides traditional Healing assistance
 - Navajo Speaking staff to assist in translation of services provided
 - Language barriers may exist
 - Gallup Satellite office works with local I.H.S. ID Doctor
 - Home visits, some may take a couple hours due to distance and road accessibility
 - Non Medical Case Management – propane, wood
 - Access to running water or electricity
