Health Information Technology – NCUIH TA Goals

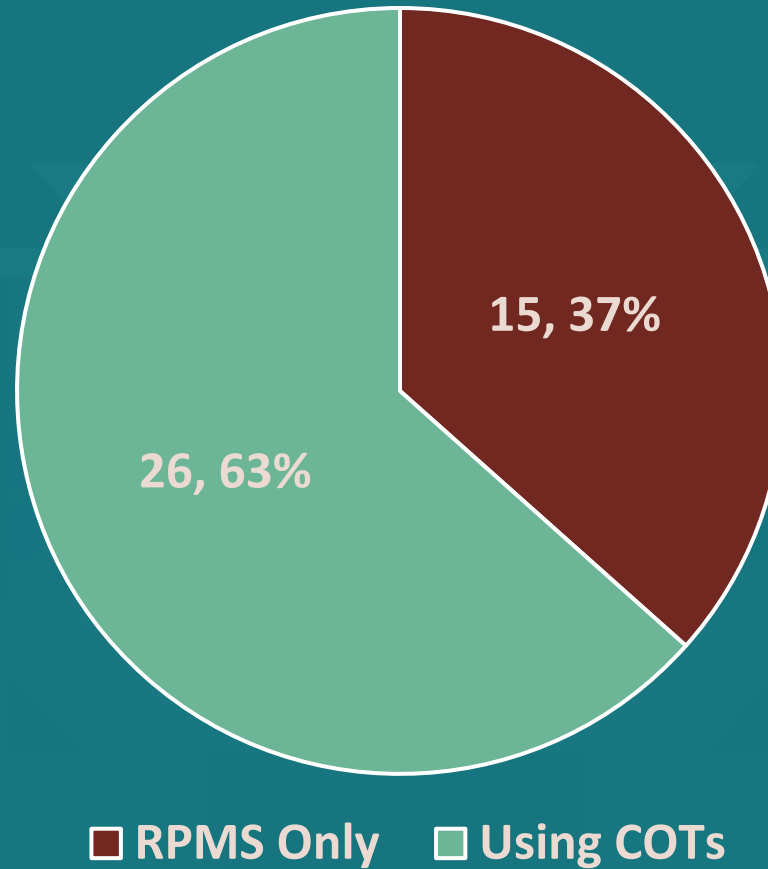
- Contract with Subject Matter Expert

Current Range of EHR Capacity and Needs

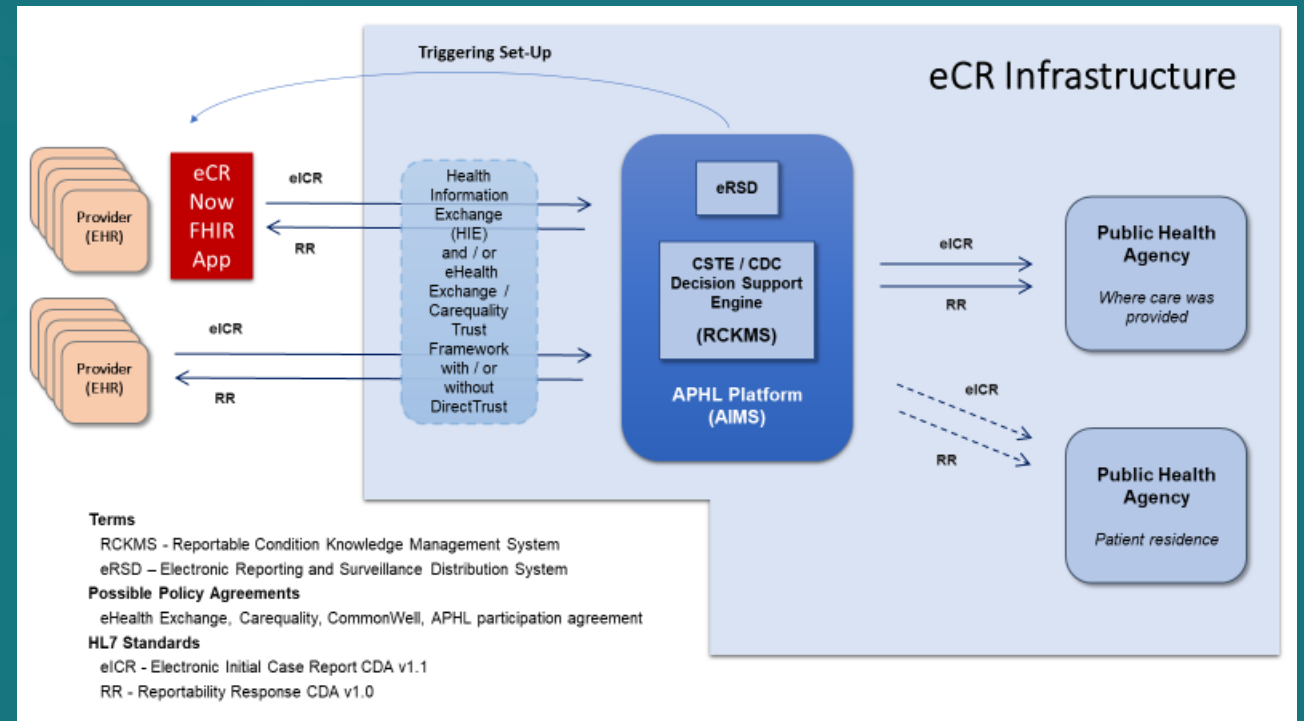




Expanding Capacities – Electronic Case Reporting (eCR)

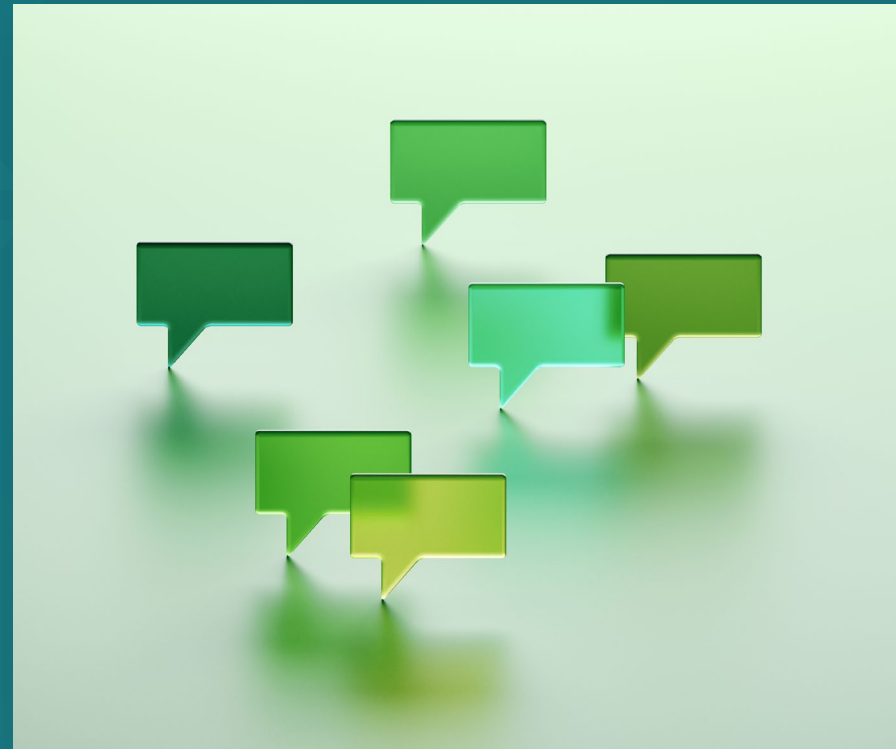
Subject Matter Expert (SME)
